Hosting a Rabies Hero Clinic and Staying Operational

Hosting a Rabies Hero vaccination clinic doesn't mean your veterinary hospital has to offer everything for free or that you don't make money. Here are suggestions for hosting a clinic and generating revenue.

- For multi-doctor practices, consider having one veterinarian focus their time on the Rabies Hero vaccination clinic. That will allow the other clinician to continue to see the same cases as before. If 15-minute appointments are offered, consider having the clinician that is doing routine work focus on longer procedures, like dentals, since there will already be a large volume of clients entering and exiting the clinic.
- For single doctor practices, or those that do not want to offer the clinic while normal operations are running, the hospital can focus the whole day/weekend on a vaccine clinic. Consider offering a set number of free or reduced cost vaccines. Offer other needed vaccines while the pet is at the appointment for the normal cost. You can even make it a fun atmosphere to make it memorable or set-up a spot where pets can be photographed for the [Photo Submission](#).
